"The Wesley Covenant Renewal Service"

In 1663, Richard Alleine, A Puritan, published Vindiciae Pietatis: or, A vindication of Godliness in the Greater Strictness and Spirituality of it. In 1753, it was again published in John Wesley's A Christian Library. Wesley used one chapter, "The Application of the Whole," on Monday, August 11, 1755, in what probably was the first real celebration of the Covenant Service in the Methodist movement.

Wesley found the service rich and meaningful, as expressed in his journal: "Many mourned before God, and many were comforted" (April, 1756); "It was, as usual, a time of remarkable blessing" (October, 1765); It was an occasion for a variety of spiritual experiences...I do not know that ever we had a greater blessing. Afterwards many desired to return thanks, either for sense of pardon, for full salvation, or for fresh manifestation of His graces, healing all their backslidings" (January 1, 1775).

In London, these services were usually held on New Year's Day. Around the country, the Covenant Service was conducted whenever John Wesley visited the Methodist Societies. In our service, the liturgy beginning with the "Invitation" is take directly from Wesley's service of 1780. The heart of the service, focused in the "Covenant Prayer," requires persons to commit themselves to God.
