What is Lent? Every year we celebrate the season of Lent and every year someone asks the question, "What is Lent, anyway?" While there are many ways of defining it, I personally like the following description.

Lent is a time to open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, it is not just another day at church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of graces God has to offer.

Lent is a season, not simply a day of remembrance. Over a period of weeks in worship and in the life of the community of faith we are reminded time and again of God's love for us. Although much of what we seek in Christianity is a search for joy, it's the Cross that keeps us coming back day after day, year after year. It is this time of year, known as Lent that reminds us of what Jesus did for us on the cross.

The late Leslie Weatherhead used to tell a story of a little boy who was admitted to an orphanage after his parents were killed. One of the first items on the agenda was to find him a new set of clothes. He was given a new pair of pants, a new shirt, and a pair of shoes that shinned as he saw his face in their glow. Lastly, he was offered a new hat. But he refused to take it. He hung on to his worse for the war hat. Finally the Sister in charge of the orphanage was able to coax him into trying on the new cap. He tried it on, liked it, but then did something very odd. He reached inside his old cap and tore the lining out and placed it in his pocket. Noticing that the Sister had a puzzled look on her face, he said, "The lining is a part of my mother's dress; it's all I have left of her and somehow it seems to bring her back!"

Lent is like that for us with Jesus. As we remember of story of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, as we worship together, celebrate communion together, pray together at the foot of the cross, somehow "it seems to bring him back" into our daily lives. And as we draw near to Christ this season we are reminded of God's love for us. We are helped to understand that God is not some nebulous energy source or a grandfather sitting in the clouds - He is so much more. Lent reminds us that God is real, that Christ's sacrifice is real, that hope is possible. The Cross is where our faith stands when all other faiths fail. Christ's sacrifice and his subsequent resurrection make new life, not only possible, but guaranteed.

Use this season to open the doors of your heart a little wider once more and be prepared to receive the overflowing grace of God.

"Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from darkness." [Genesis 1: 3-4]

Have you ever been (maybe now?) at a time where you long to have God give you clear direction or revelation? Sometimes even when we believe we have a clear sense of God's direction, we face dark obstacles.
